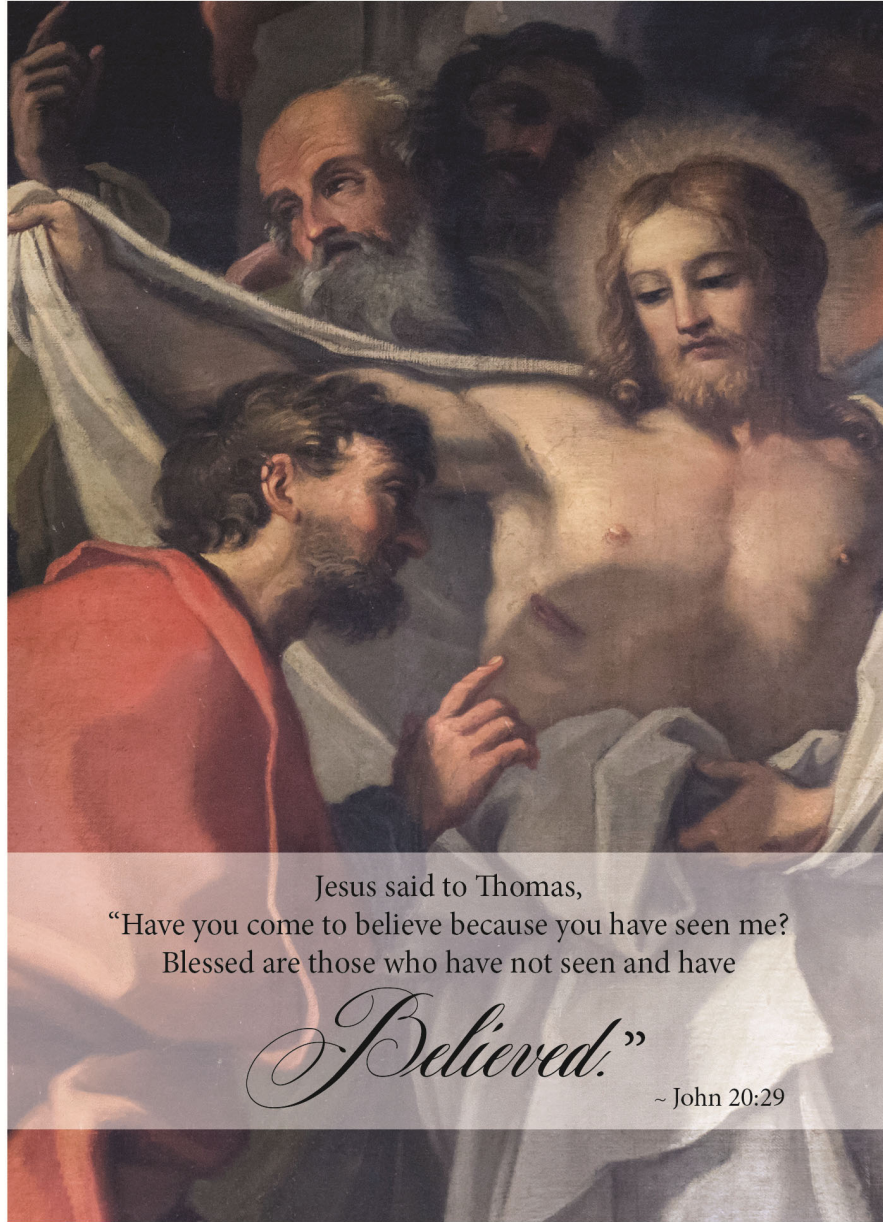

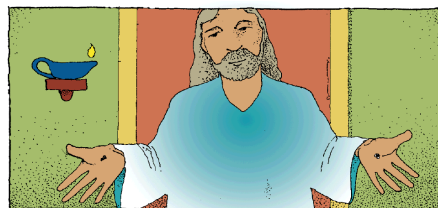

Fr. Matt's Message

As we continue in this joyful time of Easter, Pope Francis' words have become more pronounced, when he said we should never allow ourselves to be robbed of the hope that comes from the faith in the Risen Lord. This Sunday is also called Divine Mercy Sunday. Throughout the entire Church, we celebrate this joyful day, which in its pronunciation is very closely related to the truth about the Resurrection. Without Divine Mercy, there would be no Resurrection. In today's Gospel, we see Jesus, who shares His peace with His disciples. He shows the frightened apostles his pierced hands and side, provoking them in a way, to truly believe in His infinite Mercy more than in their apprehension and fears. St. Thomas said, "My Lord and my God," and St. Faustina said, „ Jesus, I trust in you." Jesus' gift of peace is not the kind of peace that this world gives; His peace is not of this world; it reconciles us with God and our neighbor. Let us accept this gift, do not be afraid. Let us put Jesus at the center of our lives, let us touch His wounds, and with determination and courage proclaim Him to the whole world.



Next Saturday, April 29, the children of our parish Religious Education Program, who will receive First Holy Communion in May; will have their first Sacrament of Reconciliation. I ask you to please remember them and their families in your prayers so that they will always remain faithful to Jesus and be grateful for the great gift of His Mercy.

Przyjmijmy ten dar, nie bójmy się. Postawmy Jezusa w centrum naszego życia, dotknijmy Jego ran i z determinacją i odwagą głośmy Go całemu światu.

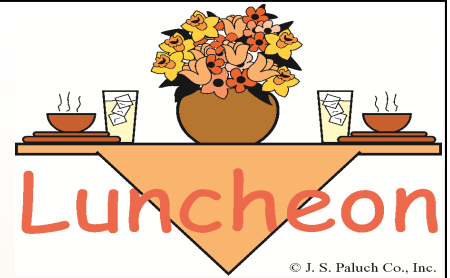

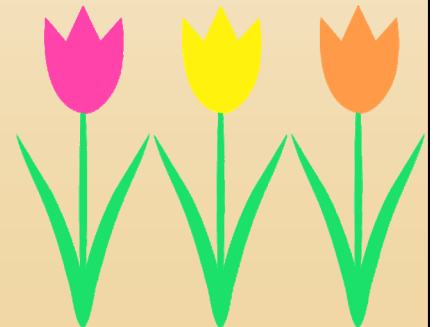

URBI ET ORBI MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS | EASTER 2017*Central loggia of the Vatican Basilica | Easter, April 16*

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy Easter!

Today, throughout the world, the Church echoes once more the astonishing message of the first disciples: “Jesus is risen!” – “He is truly risen, as he said!”

The ancient feast of Passover, the commemoration of the liberation of the Hebrew people from slavery, here finds fulfilment. By his resurrection, Jesus Christ has set us free from the slavery of sin and death, and has opened before us the way to eternal life.

All of us, when we let ourselves be mastered by sin, lose the right way and end up straying like lost sheep. But God himself, our shepherd, has come in search of us. To save us, he lowered himself even to accepting death on the cross. Today we can proclaim: “*The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep, and willingly died for his flock, alleluia*” (Roman Missal, IV Sunday of Easter, Communion antiphon).

In every age, the Risen Shepherd tirelessly seeks us, his brothers and sisters, wandering in the deserts of this world. With the marks of the passion – the wounds of his merciful love – he draws us to follow him on his way, the way of life. Today too, he places upon his shoulders so many of our brothers and sisters crushed by evil in all its varied forms.

The Risen Shepherd goes in search of all those lost in the labyrinths of loneliness and marginalization. He comes to meet them through our brothers and sisters who treat them with respect and kindness, and help them to hear his voice, an unforgettable voice, a voice calling them back to friendship with God.

He takes upon himself all those victimized by old and new forms of slavery, inhuman labour, illegal trafficking, exploitation and discrimination, and grave forms of addiction. He takes upon himself children and adolescents deprived of their carefree innocence and exploited, and those deeply hurt by acts of violence that take place within the walls of their own home.

The Risen Shepherd walks beside all those forced to leave their homelands as a result of armed conflicts, terrorist attacks, famine and oppressive regimes. Everywhere he helps these forced migrants to encounter brothers and sisters, with whom they can share bread and hope on their journey.

In the complex and often dramatic situations of today’s world, may the Risen Lord guide the steps of all those who work for justice and peace. May he grant the leaders of nations the courage they need to prevent the spread of conflicts and to put a halt to the arms trade.

Especially in these days, may he sustain the efforts of all those actively engaged in bringing comfort and relief to the civil population in beloved Syria, so greatly suffering from a war that continues to sow horror and death.

Yesterday saw the latest vile attack on fleeing refugees, resulting in the death and injury of many. May he grant peace to the entire Middle East, beginning with the Holy Land, as well as in Iraq and Yemen.

May the Good Shepherd remain close to the people of South Sudan, Sudan, Somalia and the Democratic Republic of Congo, who endure continuing hostilities, aggravated by the grave famine affecting certain parts of Africa.

May the Risen Jesus sustain the efforts of all those who, especially in Latin America, are committed to ensuring the common good of societies marked at times by political and social tensions that in some cases have resulted in violence. May it be possible for bridges of dialogue to be built, by continuing to fight the scourge of corruption and to seek viable and peaceful solutions to disputes, for progress and the strengthening of democratic institutions in complete respect for the rule of law.

May the Good Shepherd come to the aid of Ukraine, still beset by conflict and bloodshed, to regain social harmony. May he accompany every effort to alleviate the tragic sufferings of those affected by the conflict.

The Risen Lord continues to shed his blessing upon the continent of Europe. May he grant hope to those experiencing moments of crisis and difficulty, especially due to high unemployment, particularly among young people.

Dear brothers and sisters, this year Christians of every confession celebrate Easter together. With one voice, in every part of the world, we proclaim the great message: “The Lord is truly risen, as he said!” May Jesus, who vanquished the darkness of sin and death, grant peace to our days.

You may not realize this, but The Women's Center is probably the last resort many women have to help them choose life for their baby.

And while The Women's Center does fantastic work, you have to remember that there are almost 3,600 babies being aborted daily in the United States alone. If you do some quick math, and take just 2 weeks, and multiply that by 3,600 babies, that equates to 50,400 babies being aborted every 14 days!!!!

Now just visualize what happens every 2 weeks in the United States with this grave abortion statistic. In 2 weeks, the entire campus of Michigan State – gone. Another 2 weeks, University of Illinois – gone.



Another 2 weeks, Purdue – gone. Another 2 weeks, Loyola & De Paul combined – gone. Sadly, this is taking place in our nation. In a matter of just 2 months, 200,000+ lives are wiped out...gone. And in 1 year, there are over 24 Major University entire student bodies no longer in existence, or 1,209,600 babies' lives terminated.

Obviously, it's pretty evident that this is one of the most disturbing realities of our times.

The grave reality is: this is the biggest battle of our times. It's simply not a "Woman's Choice Issue", but rather, a perilous "Life at Stake" truism. We have to realize Satan wants to destroy families, and one of the best ways he can do so, is instilling fear in the expectant mother and apathy on our parts. Sadly, if we continue being complacent, we give Satan the upper hand and families suffer heart wrenching consequences.

Divine Mercy Sunday (also known as the **Feast of the Divine Mercy**) is celebrated on the Sunday after Easter, the Octave of Easter, observed by Roman Catholic. It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that Saint Faustina Kowalska reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and indulgences issued by the Church.

The feast of Divine Mercy, as recorded in the diary of Saint Faustina, receives from Jesus himself the biggest promises of grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy. Specifically, Jesus reputedly said that a person who goes to sacramental confession (the confession may take place some days before) and receives holy communion on that day, shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment. That means each person would go immediately after death to heaven without suffering in purgatory (or hell). Additionally, the Roman Catholic Church grants a plenary indulgence (observing the usual rules) with the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet.



Niedziela Miłosierdzia Bożego

Obchodzi je po raz pierwszy w ciszy własnej celi zakonnej siostra Faustyna Kowalska w 1934, z polecenia Bożego, jakie otrzymała w swoim prywatnym objawieniu. Rok później celebrowały je już wszystkie siostry Matki Bożego Miłosierdzia w klasztorze w Łagiewnikach. W 1947 r. biskupi polscy kierują prośbę do Kongregacji Obrzędów o zatwierdzenie Święta, które, ze swojej strony aprobuje kard. Sapięha dla krakowskich łagiewnik (1951). W latach 1959- 1978 obowiązuje wspomniany już wyżej zakaz szerzenia kultu w kościele w formach prywatnych przedstawionych przez s. Faustynę. W 1985 r., kard. Macharski, Metropolita Krakowski, wprowadza po raz pierwszy w swojej diecezji Święto Miłosierdzia Bożego. W 1993 odbyła beatyfikacja s. Faustyny, a dwa lata później zezwolenie na celebrowanie Święta Miłosierdzia w całej Polsce. W 2000 r., Jan Paweł II, podczas kanonizacji s. Faustyny Kowalskiej, zgodnie z treścią jej prywatnych objawień, ustanowił drugą Niedzielę Wielkanocną Świętem Miłosierdzia Bożego dla całego Kościoła.

Wybór pierwszej niedzieli po Wielkanocy nie jest przypadkowy; na ten dzień przypada bowiem oktawa Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego, które wieńczy obchody Misterium Paschalnego Chrystusa. Ten okres w liturgii Kościoła wyraźniej niż pozostałe ukazuje tajemnicę Miłosierdzia Bożego, która najpełniej została objawiona właśnie w męce, śmierci i zmartwychwstaniu Chrystusa. Nie było by bowiem dzieła odkupienia, gdyby nie było Miłosierdzia Bożego. Przygotowaniem do tego święta jest nowenna, polegająca na odmawianiu przez 9 dni, poczynając od Wielkiego Piątku, koronki do Miłosierdzia Bożego. Jak zawsze, w przypadku każdego święta, można wtedy uzyskać wiele duchowych łask odpuszczenia win grzechowych naszych zmarłych oraz nawrócenie wielu zagubionych.
